During shows & events, we rely exclusively on our BAND group for communication; this ensures that all teachers, performers, and parents are on the same page and can assist each other quickly. Similarly, the BAND app is the only platform that sends notifications directly to our faculty's phones; we won't see other notifications. Using BAND helps us ensure that any questions are seen by the whole group, and everyone can pitch in to help out fellow performers and parents. We'll provide all the information you need in advance, and BAND will be our main way to stay connected and organized during the busy performance days!

Students will be cast in roles for the spring musical following auditions in the fall. After auditions, students will have weekly rehearsals and perform a full length musical in the spring. The required courses for Marquis Productions are designed to enhance the student's performing experience as well as their skills in all three areas of dancing, singing, and acting. It not only offers a place to grow as a triple threat performer and build self-esteem, but focuses on professionalism first and foremost.

We are looking for dedicated performers aged 6-18 as of September 1, 2025 who are eager to be a part of our musical theater group. These artists demonstrate a strong work ethic, a willingness to learn, and a passion for theater. Marquis Policies

For Performers:

At Devine Performing Arts, we believe that respect, positivity, and professionalism are fundamental to our success. As a performer, you are expected to embody these values at all times. Treat your teammates, faculty, and spectators with kindness and respect, and approach every class, rehearsal, and performance with dedication and a positive attitude. Come prepared with the proper attire and materials, and be punctual and ready to participate fully. We are a drama-free studio, and we do not tolerate gossip, negativity, or speaking ill of others. Our focus is on building a supportive, inclusive environment where everyone can thrive and grow as artists.

For Parents:

Parents play a crucial role in supporting our performers and contributing to a positive studio environment. We expect parents to communicate respectfully with faculty and other parents and to address any issues directly and constructively. Your involvement in your performer's journey is vital, and we ask that you ensure they adhere to the attendance policy and participate fully in company activities. Parents are also expected to model good sportsmanship and a cooperative spirit, supporting all team members and contributing to a drama-free atmosphere. Lift up and support all our artists, teach your child the value of perseverance and work ethic, and encourage a team-oriented mindset.

Our Faculty:

Our faculty is dedicated to creating a nurturing and professional environment for all performers. We lead by example, maintaining high standards of professionalism in all interactions and providing constructive feedback to support each performer's growth. Faculty members are expected to be punctual, prepared, and fully engaged in all classes and rehearsals. We value open communication and are here to address any concerns promptly and effectively. Our commitment is to the well-being and development of our performers, and we strive to maintain a focused, drama-free studio environment at all times.

Commitment to Regular Attendance:

Regular attendance is essential for the success of our group. Performers are expected to attend all scheduled classes, rehearsals, and performances. Consistent participation is key to company cohesion and individual progress. While we understand that occasional absences may occur, frequent absences will hinder a performer's ability to perform effectively and grow as a performer, which may impact their eligibility for performances. We ask that all absences be communicated to the faculty in advance (at least 1 week) to allow for proper planning and adjustments.

Procedure for Reporting Absences:

If a performer is unable to attend a class or rehearsal, please notify Miss Debbie via email as soon as possible. For planned absences, advance notice is required. In the case of illness or emergencies, please inform us immediately. A doctor's note may be required for prolonged absences due to illness to ensure that the performer is safe to return to training. Your performer plays an integral role in our group, and their attendance affects the entire group.

Class Attendance:

To ensure continuity in training, performers are required to attend make-up classes for any required classes that they miss more than one of each month. Make-up classes should be scheduled within the next month; this helps performers stay on track with the group's progress and ensures they do not fall behind in their training. If a performer must miss a class, try to make it an elective.

Rehearsal Attendance:

If your performer misses rehearsal, it is their responsibility to get caught up before the next rehearsal. Private lessons are strongly encouraged or may be required depending on how many rehearsals they've missed. Missing too many rehearsals could result in your performer being pulled from certain parts in the show. Your performer's progress and their impact on the group are our top priorities.

Performance Attendance:

Attendance at all scheduled performances is mandatory. We rely on every performer's participation to represent Marquis Productions with excellence and pride. Moreover, our performers work incredibly hard to put their best foot forward at performances, and just one performer's absence hurts the entire group. Absences from these events will be taken seriously and may result in removal of the performer's placement on our group.

Performance Attire/Team Uniform

DPA will provide all costumes needed for the show. Performers are expected to have the following required items:

- Performance Teams T-Shirt
- Performance Leggings
- Black Fitted Shorts (for under costumes)
- Nude Leotard (for under costumes)
- All Appropriate Dance Shoes (as needed)
- All Appropriate Tights (as needed)
- DPA Team Jacket (\$150 and optional)

Rehearsal and Show Protocol:

- All performers will sign in on the sign-in sheet upon arrival to all rehearsals and shows (this includes weekly Marquis rehearsals).
- All announcements, music, and rehearsal videos and information will be posted to the Marquis Band account.
 - Rehearsal/Performance Videos and/or Photos are **NEVER** to be posted to any social media accounts.
- There is absolutely no cell phone use allowed during rehearsal time (unless otherwise stated by the rehearsal director).
- Costumes will be assigned prior to the show and must be fully accounted for at the end of dress rehearsals and shows.
 - No performer will be allowed to leave dress rehearsals or shows until each performer's costume pieces, shoes, accessories, etc. are accounted for
 - Each performer will have a laundry basket for tossing his/her costume pieces and shoes in as we go through dress rehearsals and shows to keep things from getting lost. This also helps re-hanging costumes at the end much quicker and easier.
 - Performers will leave all shoes needed for shows in their laundry baskets.

Social Media Presence:

Marquis Members must use good judgment in using social media. Don't post anything you wouldn't be okay with your grandparents seeing. Inappropriate posts will result in a warning, and if inappropriate posts continue the dancer could be terminated from the team.

Removal from the Group:

Respect must be shown to all instructors, performers, parents, and guests at all times.

- Poor attitudes will not be tolerated—not in the classroom and certainly not at outside events.
- Being disrespectful or rude to the choreographer, rehearsal director, parents, other team members, and other participants is absolutely unacceptable.
- One warning will be given to the performer and the parent before that performer is suspended.
 - If behavior is poor enough, the first warning will not be given and the performer will be terminated from the group.
 - Grounds for immediate termination include physical violence, bullying of any kind, and not showing up for an event.
 - There will be no refunds on performance fees, tuition, or costume fees.

Resigning From Marquis:

- Resigning after signing the Marquis contract but before the first rehearsal results in being responsible for full payment of the following:
 - \$50 administrative fee
- Resigning after the season has begun (September 2, 2025) will result in being responsible for full payment of the following:
 - \$50 administrative fee
 - \$50 per scene restaging fee
 - All Costume fees for non-returnable costumes

Required _____ Dress Code

Musical Theater

Required Attire:

- *Form-fitting dance wear is required. This includes a leotard and tights or leggings/bike shorts and tank top. No baggy pants or tops are allowed.*

Required Shoes:

- *Jazz: Tan Jazz Shoes. Purchase price through the studio is \$35.*

Hair:

- *Hair must be secured in a slick ponytail, braid, or bun.*

Boys

- *Please wear a solid color shirt, black pants, and black shoes (where appropriate).*

Rehearsals & Drama Voice

Required Attire:

- *Comfortable clothing you can move in*

Required Shoes:

- *No street shoes on the dance floor*

Hair:

- *Hair must be secured out of the face*

Requirements To Join

MANDATORY REQUIREMENTS

Season Classes: *mandatory*

Marquis Members are required register and pay by the first day of classes **September 2, 2025**.

- **ALL Marquis members are required to take musical theater, drama/voice, and their weekly rehearsal class.**
- Senior Marquis Members are ages 11-18.
- Junior Marquis Members are ages 7-10.
- Senior Marquis BOYS are only required to attend weekly rehearsals.
 - Pay monthly performance fee of \$35
 - Pay one time prop/costume/t-shirt fee of \$120 (due Feb 1)
 - Sell 10 tickets

Students are encouraged to take additional technique classes beyond their required classes to become more versatile performers.

Matilda JR Auditions: *mandatory*

Matilda auditions will take place at the studio on Friday, September 19, 2025. Times and sign ups will be released as we get closer.

Matilda JR Casting:

Everyone that signs up for Marquis becomes a part of the show! Our JR group members are our youth ensemble, but are eligible for roles as well. Our SR group members are our teen ensemble and are also eligible for roles.

Matilda JR Shows: *mandatory*

SHOWS MAY 1 & 2, 2026

Marquis Members are required to participate in the annual musical.

- There will be an in house dress rehearsal on April 26, 2026 from 10am-6pm.
- There is a tech/dress rehearsal at the theater April 30, 2026 from 4-9pm (jrs) 10pm (srs).
- All of these events are mandatory.
- Our shows take place at the Chesterfield YMCA Theater (Show 1 @ 7pm call time 4pm, Show 2 @ noon call time 9am)

DPA Recitals: *mandatory*

Marquis Members are required to participate in and pay for DPA's annual recitals **June 6 & 7, 2026**. This includes all events related to recital (pictures, dress rehearsal, etc).

- These take place at the Keating Theater at Kirkwood High School

OPTIONAL OPPORTUNITIES

Summer Technique Intensive: *optional*

The Technique Intensive is not required for Marquis Productions, but is highly encouraged. Dancers will take multiple classes in multiple styles each day from 9:30am-3:00pm.

Summer Classes: *optional*

Summer classes are not required for Marquis Productions, but they are highly encouraged. Musical Theater, Ballet, and Jazz are all great options!

DPA Tuition & Fees

Class Tuition

We offer two payment options: full semester or monthly installments (9 total installments). The full semester payment must be completed by September 5th or January 5th to receive a **3% discount**. Please note, we do not prorate the full semester payment option. After September 5th or January 5th, only monthly installments are available.

Additional Marquis Fees

Marquis pays an additional monthly production fee. Beyond that there are other one time fees associated with this team. All fees are detailed on the next page.

Marquis Fees & Due Dates

- Marquis rehearsals are added in with class tuition.
- Juniors Pay the 1 hour class fee and Seniors pay the 2 hour class fee. Multi-class discounts and dance card rates do apply to Marquis rehearsal tuition.

Marquis Fees (in addition to monthly tuition)

Production Fee (monthly)

Amount: \$35

Due Date: The first of each month.

Details: Monthly production fees go directly to the costs of presenting Marquis annual musical.

Team Apparel (team t-shirt and leggings)

Amount: \$65

Due Date: September 30, 2025

Details: Monthly production fees go directly to the costs of presenting Marquis annual musical.

Costume/Prop Rental Fee/Show Shirt (once)

Amount: \$120

Due Date: February 1, 2026

Details: Marquis is required to pay a costume/prop rental fee that covers your usage of costumes for the musical.

Musical Tickets

Amount: \$12 (additional fees apply for Credit Card purchases).

Due Date: Show Date

Details: Each family is required to sell 10 tickets to the musical. Tickets are sold for \$12 (additional fees apply for Credit Card purchases). Any tickets not sold will be charged to your account.

Additional DPA Fees

Recital Fees - Mandatory

Amount: \$125 (first student) \$50 (Second student) \$25 (each additional student)

Due Date: December 15, 2025

Details: Marquis is required to participate in annual recitals.

Recital Costume Fees - Optional

Amount: Determined by number of classes in addition to Marquis. (Drama/Voice classes have NO costume fee).

Due Date: December 15, 2025

Details: Marquis is required to participate in annual recitals. It is optional to participate in recital with your technique classes (ballet, jazz, musical theater, etc). Each class you add has a costume fee attached, however, drama/voice classes have no additional costume fee.

Make Up

All dancers must wear full make up for all performances. This includes foundation, neutral eye shadow, black eye liner, black mascara, false eye lashes, rosy blush, and wine lipstick.

Nail Polish and Jewelry

- All nail polish must be removed before a performance. The only acceptable colors are nude or french tips for both fingers and toes.
- All other jewelry must be removed. Think about timeline when planning to get any new piercings.

Tights and Undergarments

- Dancers are responsible to bring their tights (ordered at the beginning of the season).
- Dancers are responsible to bring all appropriate undergarments including nude leotard.

Costumes

Dancers will be given a costume bag with their costume pieces. Any pieces brought from home will be collected prior the the full dress rehearsal on April 26. They are responsible for returning any DPA provided items to the studio after the show.

Theater Etiquette Before, During, and After Performances

Please apply standard theatre etiquette while attending the musical. Do not enter or exit the theatre while a dancer is performing; wait for a break between numbers to move in and out. Make sure to turn off phone notifications or set your phone to silent mode. When watching a performance, do not stand up or move around, especially in front of cameras or other audience members, as this can obstruct parents' views and disturb the photos/videos.

Following the musical in May/June

You will still have Marquis and your regularly scheduled classes following the production. The details of those evenings will be sent out in the spring.
